A Partnership to Build West Virginia's Future

remember the day, almost twenty-six months ago, that Ullico purchased Hope Gas. We signed the agreement closing the transaction and celebrated bringing more than just the name of Hope Gas back to West Virginia with approximately 300 Hope Gas employees. We had a simple purpose, to serve West Virginians and bring hope for generations to come.

We kicked off our journey with a special event on a cold, wet November day at the Bridgeport Airport. In what's become an iconic moment for us, the late Ed Smith, then CEO of Ullico and a lifelong LIUNA card carrier, painted a picture of

what was to come in front of hundreds of organized labor leaders and workers from West Virginia. He talked about the day when union skilled labor would be laying pipe in West Virginia and the pension dollars earned by those workers would be investing in that pipeline. It was poetry and a true "circle of life" story. He lit a fire that day which continues to burn brightly today.

The West Virginia Laborers have been true partners from the beginning. Hope Gas started by making investments in West Virginia and creating family sustaining jobs. We have hired more than 250 employees across West Virginia since September 2022. We have also created hundreds of additional jobs through our pipeline infrastructure and construction work. Those jobs will continue to grow each year. Having contracting partners whose workers come



from the labor halls in West Virginia makes West Virginia a better and safer place.

Hope Gas will continue to grow our partnership with the West Virginia Laborers. As we invest millions of dollars each year into our pipeline infrastructure, we will hire West Virginia companies with West Virginia labor workforce for these projects. One of our upcoming projects alone will create about 600 additional West Virginia labor jobs. And we are committed to supporting other businesses across the state. When Hope purchases a vehicle for our fleet, we purchase it from a local car dealer instead of from Detroit. (We only buy vehicles made in America by American labor as well.) This approach further invests in the state and the families right here in West Virginia.

The safety of our customers and communities and the care for those we serve is always at the forefront. In early October, Ullico and Hope dedicated our state-of-the-art natural gas and hydrogen training center in Clarksburg, WV in memory of Edward M. Smith, whose visionary leadership at Ullico Inc. profoundly impacted the labor movement. The Edward M. Smith National Career and Life Skills Development Center will provide training, not only for today's workers, but also for the future generations of our energy and labor workforce.

Today, only two years from when we started, our partnership continues to strengthen. As Hope Gas continues to work with WV Laborers, I have come to realize that our shared values and purpose is going to offer even more to the Mountain State than I could have imagined. Together, we will continue to support West Virginia families through the creation of family-sustaining jobs, improve the energy infrastructure throughout the state to encourage more economic development opportunities, and provide training opportunities that will allow generations to come to have bright futures right here in West Virginia.

I would like to thank all of you for your support of Hope Gas. I look forward to continuing our work together to build West Virgnina's future.





Members enjoy comprehensive health, vision, and dental insurance, along with the industry's premier pension and annuity plans. Signatory Contractors benefit from access to a Local Union Hiring Hall, which provides a trained and skilled workforce that is readily available. These shared advantages arise from contributions negotiated through collective bargaining, and we owe our gratitude to the West Virginia Appalachian Laborers District Council, our Contractors' Associations, and the exceptional Signatory Union contractors. Without the collaborative Labor-Management partnerships, these benefits would not exist.

Additionally, there are other advantages that may be underutilized known collectively as the LIUNA Tri-Funds, which consist of: 1. LIUNA Training Centers, 2. Laborers-Employers Cooperation and Education Trust, 3. Laborers Health & Safety Fund of North America.

*We will provide a brief overview of each component of the Tri-Funds and their respective benefits.

- 1. LIUNA Training: The LIUNA network boasts 83 Training Centers across North America, offering innovative training programs for both Members and Contractors. This helps cultivate a skilled workforce equipped with the necessary knowledge, skills, and abilities to contribute to the construction of America. Our LIUNA Training Centers also play a crucial role in preparing future members through Registered Apprenticeship programs run by Jointly Administered Training Committees (JATCs). - 2. Laborers-Employers Cooperation and Education Trust (LECET): This organization assists LIUNA contractors in identifying new construction markets, providing effective marketing strategies, and focusing on all LIUNA projects. This support ensures fair bidding practices, enabling LIUNA Contractors to remain competitive and, in turn, employ more LIUNA members. - 3. The Laborers Health and Safety Fund of North America (LHSFNA) provides invaluable support to LIUNA Members and Contractors in two primary areas. First, it focuses on occupational safety at job sites by assisting contractors in conducting complimentary safety audits. This support ensures regulatory compliance and promotes safe work environments for LIUNA members. Additionally, LHSFNA aids in developing company safety plans that include toolbox talks and various other resources. Second, LHSFNA addresses occupational health by assisting members and contractors with Critical Incident Stress Management following accidents or tragedies, raising awareness about mental health (available through 988), implementing drug-free workplace initiatives and testing programs, as well as promoting skin cancer awareness and smoking cessation programs to foster healthy lifestyle choices.
